Do you need to do research on a specific disease while seeing patients at the hospital? Are you doing rounds and need detailed drug information right away? Do you need access to your RefWorks bibliography right away? Do you know you can access some of the Library's databases on your iPhone, iPad, Blackberry or Android mobile device?

New Open Journal in eScience

The inaugural issue of the [Journal of eScience Librarianship](#) (JESLIB) was published by the University of Massachusetts Medical School in January 2012. This open access, peer-reviewed journal explores the many roles of librarians in supporting eScience and includes articles related to education, outreach, collaborations and current practices on data-driven research in the physical, biological, and medical sciences.

JESLIB will include special features such as book reviews and information on new technologies on subjects of interest to eScience librarians.

This project has been partially funded by the National Library of Medicine, National Institutes of Health, Department of Health and Human Services, under Contract No. N01-LM-6-3508 with the University of Massachusetts Medical School.

New Database: Methods Navigator

Methods Navigator provides a time-saving structure for life scientists that facilitates search, retrieval and application of correct laboratory methods. Drawing on content from *Methods in Enzymology*, *Methods in Cellular Biology*, and more than 40,000 articles from 15 primary and methods journals (all published by Elsevier,) *Methods Navigator* also includes 120 of the most commonly-used protocols. The database combines multiple taxonomies into a single ontology to search across these resources (organized into 60,000 topics) for the methods and protocols you need.

Individual (free) registration allows you to bookmark materials for quick retrieval from a personal storage area called **MyMethods**. Protocols can also be downloaded to a computer and opened with Word; users are free to edit them and upload the changed documents into **MyMethods**, from which point they can also be shared with other *Methods Navigator* users.

Accessing "[Help](#)" opens a pop-up window with Help contents and a link on the top menu to a short 3-part video tutorial. Scopus users will notice many familiar search and filtering features in *Methods Navigator*.

To access *Methods Navigator*, you need to **activate** JavaScript and **use** a browser updated within the past year.

NEJM does not currently offer this PowerPoint download feature as part of a library's institutional subscription; you may wish to take advantage of this free trial.
