## New Website and Discover Search Coming Soon

The HAM-TMC Library will soon present a new face, with new features, to our user community. We will inaugurate an updated website in October, one that will provide more than the cosmetic changes that will be immediately noticed.

One of the most innovative features is the prominent "Discover" search box, which allows the user to enter search terms once, wait a few seconds and receive results drawn from several different resources, including PubMed, Science Direct, Scopus, and the Library catalog. This new search tool retrieves results by adapting itself to the search conventions of each separate database, translating the data, and presenting it as a list and as subject clusters.

Library collections are available in print and/or electronic formats, currently providing access to:

- 9,101 electronic journals
- 172 databases
- 5,167 electronic books
- 165 print journals

Electronic access is available from library computers and, according to your level of authorization, from other TMC institutions, or offsite (see Remote Access below).

General Information The Library is open 99 hours per week.

#### **Directions and Parking**

The Library is located in the heart of the TMC at 1133 John Freeman Blvd. Parking is available underneath the Library in Garage 3, or in Garage 4 and costs \$10.00 maximum per day.

The Circulation Desk issues library cards, checks out books, journals and audiovisuals, supplies photocopy cards for a fee and houses a Core Collection of non-circulating resources. A fax service is also available to library users. Contact the Circulation Desk 713.799.7147 for more information.

#### Photocopy/Interlibrary Loan (PC/ILL) Department

Books, articles and other materials not available at the

Library can be borrowed from other libraries for a fee. Feebased photocopying from Library-held materials is available to individuals and other libraries. Self-serve photocopiers (located on the 1st and 2nd floors) cost \$.25/page cash or \$.20/page on a copy card.

#### **Computers & Photocopiers**

All public computers are equipped with Internet access and a variety of software. Photocopiers are available on the first and second floors. There is a \$.20/page fee for copy cards, a \$.25/page cash fee to print in black and white and a \$.50/page charge to print in color. The computer lab closes 30 minutes before the Library closes each day.

#### How to apply for Library cards

Faculty, students and staff from all Governing and Supporting institutions of the Texas Medical Center, as well as members of Harris County Medical Society, are eligible for library cards. Health care providers who are not cardholders can receive some services through our affiliation with the National Network of Libraries of Medicine South Central Region.

#### **Remote Access**

Remote & Off-Campus Access is available to registered users. The HAM-TMC Library is implementing a new remote access account registration form available on its new website in October. The new form requires a minimum of information, including your name, institutional affiliation, and institutional email address. Once you have submitted the form, you will receive a verification email and, after you click the URL provided, you will then be sent your username and password by email. At that point, you will be able to access the Library's resources remotely. This new process will make getting the information you need much easier and faster.

#### **Regional Medical Library**

Under contract with the National Library of Medicine, the HAM-TMC Library serves as the Regional Medical Library for the National Network of Libraries of Medicine South Central Region (NN/LM SCR). The NN/LM SCR's mission is to improve access to medical information within the SCR, enabling healthcare providers and consumers to make informed healthcare decisions. 1.800.338.7657.

# Friends of the TMC Library Spud Britt Book Fund

The Friends of the TMC Library Britt Book Fund is now 15 years old. This Fund was established by the Friends of the TMC Library following his death in 1993. "Spud" Kyle Britt, Sr. was an avid supporter of education and the tools necessary to obtain an education. This Fund, dedicated to purchasing books, has been used to provide the HAM-TMC Library with vital texts which support the educational research and patient care institutions of the Texas Medical Center.

Examples of books purchased include: Netter's Illustrated Human Pathology Biological Weapons Defense Infectious Diseases and Counter Bioterrorism Infectious Diseases and Host-Pathogen Evolution Neurology in Clinical Practice and Peripheral Nerve Lesions Nerve Surgery and Secondary Reconstructive Repair

"Spud" was born in Junction, TX on September 1, 1920. Spud's father was Superintendent of Schools in Round Rock TX and his mother was a teacher. Early immersion in books and education created a deep love for both in him. He was a University of Texas graduate, a veteran of World War II (U.S. Navy), worked at Exxon for 38 years and was a member of St. Luke's Methodist Church.

He loved his time serving as President of the Friends of the TMC Library Board, a 501(c)3 organization which exists to support the mission of the HAM-TMC Library. "Spud" planned the first dinner fundraiser to provide financial support for Library was the start of numerous successful Most Fascinating dinner events.

"Spud" fell ill and died toward the end of his Friends of the TMC Library presidency. After his death, the Friends honored Spud by establishing the Friends of the TMC Library Spud Britt Book Fund. Robin Burke Britt, EdD, RN, Spud's daughter-in-law, has served on the Friends Board since Spud's death and reminds us that his energy, devotion to family, church, community and to Houston were unparalleled. Therefore, as we remember "Spud" on the 15th anniversary of his death, we hope you will remember the Spud Britt Book Fund with a sustaining contribution of \$100 or more. Donations to this anniversary commemoration of the Fund will be recognized on a plaque that will be placed in the HAM-TMC Library.
