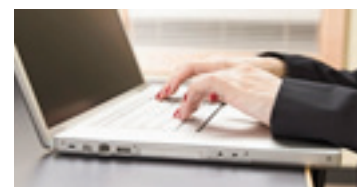

Editorial Cartoons Exhibit at the Library until April 5, 2008

Cartoonists Take Up Smoking is an exhibit of editorial cartoons which addresses the health, economic and social issues of tobacco use in the 20th century. It is on view at the Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center Library until April 5, 2008.



Although the health consequences of smoking and chewing tobacco have been documented in medical literature and to the public, sometimes a picture (with a caption) is indeed worth a thousand words. The exhibit includes work originally published in local media. Advertisements including those in medical journals are shown in the exhibit.

The exhibit is sponsored by The University of Alabama Center for the Study of Tobacco and Society, The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center and Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center Library.

Library Receives Consumer Health Award from NN/LM SCR

The HAM-TMC Library received an Access to Electronic Consumer Health Information award from the NN/LM SCR to develop and implement the *South Central Houston Community Health Information Center* project. This project partners the Library and South Central Houston Community Health Center (SCHCHC). SCHCHC is the oldest Federally Qualified Health Center in Houston. Project funds will be used to develop a health information center at SCHCHC's Riverside Clinic facility. The health information center will include ten Internet-connected computers and a networked printer for client/patient use. Project funds will also be used to provide on-site instruction on use of electronic consumer health information resources. The project extends the "information prescription" model in that health care providers and clinic staff members at South Central Houston Community Health Center will refer clients/patients to the health information center to gain a better understanding of health-related issues.
