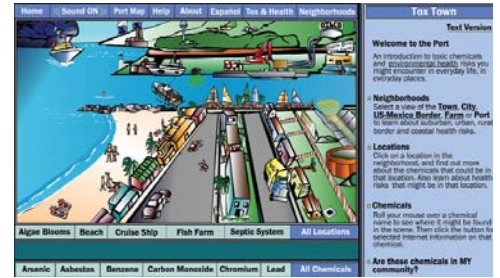
Books Have Been Removed from Links Menu in PubMed®

The Books option on PubMed Links is no longer available. This function used to link the content of PubMed abstracts to the Bookshelf via concept terms. Books continue to be linked from a PubMed abstract if the corresponding article has been cited in a book through the link *Cited in Books*. An improved feature providing concept links from PubMed to Bookshelf Books will be added in the future.
