- Section 1. Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Republic of Texas in Congress assembled, that the Auditor be, and he is hereby, authorized and required to audit the claims of the following named persons, to wit: to audit the claim of Martin Lacy for supplies furnished the army for five hundred and fifteen dollars;
