Digitization: Designing the Future, Preserving the Past was the theme of the Houston Academy of Medicine–Texas Medical Center (HAM–TMC) Library's *Fourth Annual Houston Conference on Health Informatics*, held Monday June 5, 2000 in the Kleberg Auditorium at Baylor College of Medicine.
