#### Darwin and Rare Scientific Books

On Thursday November 5, the HAM-TMC Library will host an all day event on *Darwin and Rare Scientific Books to* conclude *Darwin2009* activities. John Lienhard, PhD, will speak on the history of the publication of scientific events and medical texts. Howard Rootenberg, owner of B&L Rootenberg Fine and Rare Books will appraise scientific medical texts and will give a lecture on finding and collecting rare books. Shannon Basher, MLS, will review recent scientific fiction books on Darwin and evolution.

The National Library of Medicine exhibit <u>Rewriting the Book of Nature: Charles Darwin</u> and the Rise of <u>Evolutionary Theory</u> is currently on display at the library as part of <u>Darwin2009</u> activities and will be on display until January 2010.

A tour of the exhibit and the McGovern Historical Collection will be held at 3:00 p.m. on that day.

## PubMed Redesign

PubMed will have a new interface in the coming weeks. When you access the new interface, you will notice the **Search Bar** has been moved to the middle of the page. A pull-down menu will retain the same information to search all different databases. Links to Advanced Search, Help and Feedback are located to the right of the **Search Bar**.

Access to the tools previously found on the PubMed homepage blue sidebar can now be found under **Using PubMed**, **PubMed Tools** and **More Resources** in the middle of the page. At the bottom of the new PubMed page there are links to other NCBI resources.

Among the changes we expect to see are:

- A pull down menu of **Display Settings** choices appears after doing a search. This
  new feature replaces the Display, Show and Sort By menus and it should be used to
  change results to a different format, items per page and sort result
- The Abstract Plus and Citation display formats have been combined
- The limits, Preview/Index, History and Details tabs have been consolidated into the Advanced search
- RSS feeds and Save search features display after running a PubMed search
- Free article links display to the right side of the results
- Clipboard citations display the message <u>Item in clipboard</u> instead of displaying the citation number in green
