Providing practical case studies and research on the transformative potential of policy change, JARC issues provide a powerful link between data and policy solutions to strengthen the arguments of child advocates across the country.

Maternal morbidity and mortality is a critical issue in the United States and has obvious effects on children, communities and society. This issue is dedicated to discussing existing policies and how they may impact maternal morbidity and mortality.

This special issue of the *Journal of Applied Research on Children* will feature papers focused on the leading causes of mortality and severe maternal morbidity, including maternal mental health, substance use disorder, hemorrhage, infectious diseases, interpregnancy and postpartum care and state and national quality, safety and equity improvement efforts. We are additionally seeking topics that authors feel may add further insight into combating the maternal health crisis in the United States.

The Journal of Applied Research on Children is available online in an open-access format (jarc.childrenatrisk.org) and is indexed in CINAHL and SocINDEX, making it available to child advocates, researchers, practitioners, and policymakers across America. Since its launch, journal articles have been downloaded over 165,000 times worldwide. The submission and rigorous double-blind peer review process are completed entirely online. Authors are encouraged to take advantage of the journal's online format by including videos, interactive charts, or links to online resources.
