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Expectations

As an Editorial Board member, you are an ambassador of the Journal. As such, there is an expectation that all members act in an ethical and professional manner at all times. All editorial board members should be familiar with and uphold the principles and guidelines set forth by the Council of Science Editors and the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors.

The editorial board will meet virtually *twice a year* to discuss the status and goals of the publication. Attendance is highly encouraged. Should a member be unable to attend, they must review and acknowledge the minutes taken within 30 days. Ideally, board members who are unable to attend the meeting will have an individual conference with the Editor-in-Chief and/or the Chairman of the Editorial Board to ensure their thoughts and ideas are included in the journal progression and plan.

A key aspect of editorial board meetings will be the identification of topics and potential authors for upcoming issues. Editorial board members will be expected to put forth areas of interest and to **solicit experts to submit manuscripts and/or editorials** that are relevant and needed.

Peer-review is essential to the integrity of the journal. As an editorial board member, you are expected to *review at least two manuscripts* each year. Alternatively, board members can recruit other experts who may have more specific knowledge or experience in the field that is discussed in the manuscript.

Confidentiality

All information regarding the discussion at editorial board meetings is to be held in confidence. Further, any information related to submitted manuscripts is to be confidential. The documents should only be shared and discussed with those directly involved in the evaluation, review, and publication process.

Conflict of Interest

Each year, editorial board members will be requested to complete a conflict of interest disclosure. Should a conflict of interest be discovered in regards to a manuscript that is under review, the editoral board member should refrain from serving as a reviewer.
